

Measurements taken by scientists of the Siberian Tiger Project in Sikhote-Alin range from 178 to 208 cm (70 to 82 in) in head and body length measured in straight line, with an average of 195 cm (77 in) for males; and for females ranging from 167 to 182 cm (66 to 72 in) with an average of 174 cm (69 in). The average tail measures 99 cm (39 in) in males and 91 cm (36 in) in females. The longest male "Maurice" measured 309 cm (122 in) in total length (tail of 101 cm (40 in)) and had a chest girth of 127 cm (50 in). The longest female "Maria Ivanna" measured 270 cm (110 in) in total length (tail of 88 cm (35 in)) and had a chest girth of 108 cm (43 in). These measurements show that the present Amur tiger is longer than the Bengal tiger and the African lion. [6] According to modern research of wild Siberian tigers in Sikhote-Alin, an average adult male of more than 35 months of age weighs 176.4 kg (389 lb), the average asymptotic limit being 222.3 kg (490 lb); an adult tigress weighs 117.9 kg (260 lb). The mean weight of historical Siberian tigers is supposed to be higher: 215.3 kg (475 lb) for male tigers and 137.5 kg (303 lb) for females. [7] In May 2011, a male called "Banzai" weighing 207 kg (460 lb) was radio-collared. This individual is heavier but smaller in size than a previously radio-collared male. [8]

Measurements of more than fifty captured individuals suggest that body size is similar to that of Bengal tigers. [9]

The largest male, with largely assured references, measured 350 cm (140 in) "over curves", equivalent to 330 cm (130 in) between pegs. The tail length in fully grown males is about 1 m (39 in). Weights of up to 318 kg (700 lb) have been recorded and exceptionally large males weighing up to 384 kg (850 lb) are mentioned in the literature but, according to Mazák, none of these cases can be confirmed via reliable sources. [10]

A further unconfirmed report tells of a male tiger shot in the Sikhote-Alin Mountains in 1950 weighing 384 kg (850 lb) with an estimated length of 3.48 m (11.4 ft). In some cases, Siberian tigers in captivity reached a body weight of up to 465 kg (1,030 lb), such as the tiger "Jaipur". [11]

#### [edit] Skull

The skull of the Siberian tiger is distinguished by its larger overall size, as well as the development of its sagittal crest, whose height and strength exceeds that of other tigers and the lion. [4] The skull prominences, especially sagittal crest and crista occipitalis are very high and strong in old males, and often much more massive than usually observed in the biggest skulls of Indian tigers. The size variation in skulls of Siberian tigers ranges from 331 to 383 mm (13.0 to 15.1 in) in 9 individuals measured. A female skull is always smaller and never so heavily built and robust as that of a male. The height of the sagittal crest in its middle-part reaches as much as 27 mm (1.1 in), and in its posterior part up to 46 mm (1.8 in). [12]

Female skulls range from 279.7 to 310.2 mm (11.01 to 12.21 in). The skull length of the males from Turkestan had a maximum length of 297.0 to 365.8 mm (11.69 to 14.40 in), while that of females measured 195.7 to 255.5 mm (7.70 to 10.06 in). In January 1954, a tiger killed on the Sumbar in Kopet-Dag had a skull greatest length of 385 mm (15.2 in), which is considerably more than the known maximum for this population and slightly exceeds that of most Far Eastern tigers. However, it's condylobasal length was of only 305 mm (12.0 in), smaller than those of the Amur tigers, with a maximum recorded condylobasal length of 342 mm (13.5 in). [6] The biggest skull of a Siberian tiger from Manchuria measured 406 mm (16.0 in) in length, which is about 20-30 mm (0.79-1.2 in) more than the maximum skull lengths achieved by tigers from the Amur region and northern India. [13] The geographical range of Amur tigers in the Russian Far East stretches south to north for almost 1.000 km (620 mi) throughout the length of Primorsky Krai and into southern Khabarovsk Krai east and south of the Amur River. They also occur within the Eastern Manchurian mountain system, which crosses into Russia from China at several places in southwest Primorye. In both regions, peaks are generally 500 to 800 m (1,600 to 2,600 ft) above sea level, with only a few reaching 1,000 m (3,300 ft) or more. This region represents a merger zone of two bioregions: the East Asian coniferous-deciduous complex and the northern boreal complex, resulting in a mosaic of forest types that vary with elevation.

In recent years, captive breeding of tigers in China has accelerated to the point where the captive population of several tiger subspecies exceeds 4,000 animals. Three thousand specimens are reportedly held by 10–20 "significant" facilities, with the remainder scattered among some 200 facilities. This makes China home to the second largest captive tiger population in the world, after the <u>USA</u>, which in 2005 had an estimated 4,692 captive tigers. [341] In a census conducted by the US based Feline Conservation Federation, 2,884 tigers were documented as residing in 468 American facilities. [351]

Ruck:

Thanks for sending me the production issue of BATTLE STARS to replace the one I didn't get. As usual, it was very informative.

I have an idea, maybe erroneous, as to why the original may have disappeared on its way to my house. On page 18 the second article is about Eugene Schumacher who lived in Joliet. In the obituary it mentions that he worked for the U. S. Postal Service. Maybe some of his work buddies from years back decided to keep that issue for personal reasons.

As 1 said when I talked to you by phone, I had a brother-in-law (now deceased) who worked as a mail man in Joliet years ago. He said that he read every magazine that he delivered. He showed me a way to handle the magazines so that they could be read without ever appearing to have been opened. Nice guy, huh.

I might add, though, that he apparently did not teach that to all his co-workers because this was the only issue of BATTLE STARS that I have received in recent years that came in pristine condition. All the others came to in the condition of a used library book. Maybe it's because the second mailing came in a sealed envelope. This makes me sound paranoid, I know, but I guess my mail is not into the condition.

On the bottom half of page 23 is an article about the Chinese push through the 555th field artillery battalion on July 14, 1953. In looking back (hindsight is always 20-20), I wish the army would have interviewed the survivors through a highly trained interrogater in order to get each person's story as soon as possible arter the action.

From what I saw, it seemed to be a microcosm of the complete range of human behavior. A very good friend of mine was no more than thirty feet away from me during much of that event, yet we didn't see each other, and our experiences were similar in general, yet significantly different in some

details. After we received adequate replacements, the army could have interviewed a few men at a time over several days. Right after it happened nearly everyone was willing to talk about it.

When I got home and found that no one cared about Korea, I clammed up. I talked with it starting about 1985, and then only with guys who were in the outfit in Korea.

If you want to hear more, Ruck, give me a call. I will not put it in writing. Unfortunately, those of us who survived, like Glenn Horne who is mentioned in the obituaries on page 19 are quickly passing away and many of the others either won't talk about it or can't remember all the facts.

I see by the membership roster that you were in George Company in 1952-1953. Do you remember a guy whose last name was Grenier. If I'm not mistaken he was from Kentucky. He was good friends with one of our forward observers, Ken Bear, who was from around Aurora, Indiana. Are you still in touch with Grenier?

I'd like to get in touch with Bear, but I lost all touch with him although he did go to a 5th RCT reunion at least 11 years ago. He signed in, but left no address.


If you can help me out, Ruck, fine. If you can't, well, that's life. I won't blame you, tht's for sure.

To sort of repeat myself, this issue of BATTLE STARS brought back a lot of memories. If you want to hear a version of the overrun that is different than the army's but which agrees with those of at least two living survivors, give me a call. That is, if you want to hear me talk for at least an hour. I have unlimited long distance coverage on my phone. If you can't afford the call, call me and I'll call you back. If you quote me, I may deny it. But so help me God, what I say will be the truth as I remember it.

I worked the equivalent of 50 years full time. I put myself through collegge for a bachelors degree without the G I bill. Later I got a masters plus a year and half beyond (almost a doctors degree). Before my 35 years of teaching, I was a construction laborer (AF of L), then a member of the UAW, then a member of the Steelwork Union, a member of the United Cement, Lime, and Gypsum workers, and a member of the OIL, Chemical, and Atomic Workers. When I went into teaching, I had non-union teaching jobs for 31/2 years and then went another non-union job, and then became a member of the American Federation of I mention these jobs only because in all those years no one called me a liar.

So, anyway, Ruck, thanks again for the BATTLE STARS. That's it.






