





After spending a few days trying to find what unit the below individual assigned to during the Korean War, I finally was able to get the proper information. The first citation I found for the DSC indicated he was assigned to Company B, 5th RCT, 1st Cav Div. Knowing the confusion that was created during the Korean War between the 5th RCT & the 5th Cav Rgt, I kept looking and finally found a copy of the citation that included the GO for the award and indicated the 5th RCT was attached to the 24th ID during that period, which was correct. Below is a copy of the Obituary followed by a copy of the citation for the DSC.

GROVETOWN, Ga. - Floyd C. Pelfrey, 81, entered into rest on Thursday, September 30, 2010 at the Georgia War Veterans Home. Funeral services will be held at 1:00 PM on Tuesday, November 9, 2010 at Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, VA. Floyd retired from the United States Army after 27 years of service and was a proud veteran. During his military career, he was the recipient of the Distinguished Service Cross, the Silver Star, and two Bronze Stars. He was a combat veteran of the Korean War (See Below) and served three tours in Vietnam. Floyd was a loving husband, father, and grandfather. He loved his family and his country. Floyd also worked for Kroger as the Seafood Manager for 10 years. Survivors include his loving wife of 59 years, Phyllis Pelfrey of Grovetown, GA, one son, Timothy Scott Pelfrey and wife Nancy Jean of Asheville, NC, one brother, Charles Edward Pelfrey and wife Wilma Ruth of Ashland, KY, four grandchildren, Christopher Pelfrey, Phyllis Sue Costello, Tiffany Carpenter, John Levi Pelfrey, and five great grandchildren. Pelfrey, United States Army, for extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy of the United Nations while serving with Company B, 1st Battalion, 5th Regimental combat Team, attached to the 24th Infantry Division. Sergeant Pelfrey distinguished himself by extraordinary heroism in action against enemy aggressor forces in the

vicinity of Pagdangdong-ni, Korea, on 13 October 1951. On that date, Company B was engaged in an attack against well-fortified enemy positions. As the battle raged, intense enemy fire accounted for several casualties among the friendly troops including the platoon leader of the 2d platoon. Immediately taking charge of the platoon, Sergeant Pelfrey led the men forward until a heavy volume of automatic-weapons fire from a hostile emplacement halted the advance. At this point, with utter disregard for his personal safety, Sergeant Pelfrey single-handedly charged the enemy position and destroyed it with hand grenades. Shouting words of encouragement, he led his men forward. Twice more, the platoon was stopped short of their objective by deadly accurate fire

from enemy emplacements and both times Sergeant Pelfrey assaulted them in such an aggressive manner that they were successfully neutralized. Sergeant Pelfrey charged forward and his men, inspired by his fearless action, overran the enemy position and inflicted numerous casualties among the hostile troops.





Thanks for all the Battle Stars newsletters. I have been reading several of them. I have a couple of questions, when did we arrive in Korea ? Was it 51 or 52 ? I forget these kinds of dates.

I believe I was discharged in 53, with four years of service! I read in the newsletter; 23 Jan 51 – July – October 1952, 42nd Scout Dog Platoon, 26th Inf. Regt. 1st Div. No Way, They were still in Bamberg Germany thru 1953. They didn't have a Scout Dog Platoon that I was aware of!? I visited the 1st Div. Museum in Wheaton, IL. In 1960 and they never showed any record of service in Korea!? They did serve in Vietnam. Only one (1) RCT at a time, never the full division. In 1963 they went to aircraft (helicopters) as their mod of transportation and became an Air Assault Regt. They lost a hell of a lot of troops, over 600 in a single period of deployment. I don't know how many wounded, but lots. The 26th was there during the Tet-offenesive. Well enough about that BS.

Do you drive? I am thinking about moving to Tybee Island by Savannah, Ga. I have been there several times for short visits and love the place.


In reading the newsletter, I didn't see anything about membership or dues. I am not much of a joiner, but if you would like, I would be happy to become member. Let me know.

About the 42nd Scout Dog Platoon 26 Inf. Rgt. 1st Div, they were the only Dog Platoon left in the army! And T.D. Yed from Bamburg to Korea in rotation wearing Big Red One, and Blue Spades!

If you ever see the Korean War Monument in D.C. there is clearly engraved a Scout Dog and it's handler in a panel near the end!

Yes, I drive a Dodge 150 Red Pickup Truck! Yes, I think you should join. All the info you need is on page 31 at bottom!


Al McAdoo was an E. Co. Radioman from Mass! He has a picture of you with a few other guvs.
