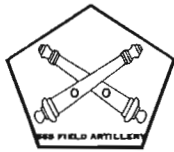

## FLESHING OUT THE PIPELINE, 1950

I'LL TRY, SIR!

The "Pipeline" was a means to assemble replacements for Overseas Assignments.

The Army was downsizing rapidly in 1945-46. At Camp Miles Standish in Massachusetts alone over one million men, including whole Divisions, were discharged during this period. Some units were retained for occupation duties but most of their strength would be offered separation and many were discharged. These vacancies would be filled by individuals from the states via the pipeline!

The United States responded to the United Nations request to Commit Troops to Korea in response to the invasion of the Republic of Korea (ROK) by the North Koreans' (NKPA) crossing the 38th Parallel on JUNE 25, 1950. The U.S. Army had four Divisions in Japan.

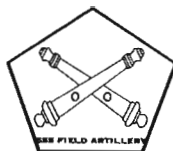
These Divisions were understrength, adequate for the Occupation Mission, but inadequate for the new mission that they would be called upon to provide. Every element of these Divisions was at reduced strength by about one third. In addition the support elements had only Light Tanks and fewer guns in the Artillery. The Infantry Regiments had only two Battalions instead of the usual three.

The deployment of troops committed was limited to Battalion sized units due to limited transport from Japan to Korea. In addition to the limitations offered the next crisis would be the shortages of ammunition. Training stocks while adequate for training purposes however the expenditures in Combat would quickly consume the limited stocks on hand.

The commitment of under strength units, piece-meal would prove to be costly in casualties and the flow of Replacements through the existing pipeline system would prove to be in-adequate. The needed replacements would come from state side units. These Units would be directed to transfer trained personnel wherever available. Newly inducted recruits currently in training would not be available for several more months. As an aside, in 1959 I met an old soldier with a Medical Discharge. He had served an indefinite enlistment. He told me he ended up in Korea as a result of this sweep. Someone finally looked at his 201 file which indicated he was born in 1890, and sixty years old. He was reassigned to Japan. He had his wife and his 1949 caddy shipped overseas too somehow!

Someone got the bright idea to activate "Inactive Enlisted Reservists". These individuals would be late WW II who were trained for assignments, but were unneeded at the Wars end. They would be separated but would have a six year commitment prior to final discharge. Some Post war enlistees on three year enlistments would be discharged prior to the beginning of the war in June 1950. Draftees however could get caught up in the Inactive call up.

I found one draftee from Hawaii who was to be separated after June 25, 1950. To keep his records straight he was separated and transferred in to the inactivate reserves. At the same time he was activated and placed on active duty, and all on the same day!



Other United Nations countries, were slow to commit troops. Over twenty would eventually make commitments. United States Naval and Air force units were quick to respond as they had all manner of Units already in the Far East. The British were the first, other than the United States to respond with Naval Units and some Ground Troops from Hong Kong.

The Activated Enlisted Reserves would be activated for one year and all would be separated by Christmas 1951. Your author has extensive National Archives Material collected after several visits since 1990. My Archive collection is mostly limited to the 5th Regimental Combat Team (RCT). The flow of Enlisted Reserve (ER )replacements into the 5th RCT began in earnest in December 1950. It peaked in January and was completed by the end of March 1951.

We pick up the 5th RCT story in December, 1950. The first enlisted reservist were reporting into the 24th Division replacement company. The 5th RCT was in division reserve after the intervention of the Chinese Communist Forces, (CCF) in November 1950. The 8th Army under the command of General Walker ordered the Eighth Army to cease offensive operations, and to begin an orderly withdrawal to the south.

The Second Division was chosen to cover the withdrawal. Errors were made at all levels and as a result the second Division was to take heavy casualties at the battle of Kunu-ri. The CCF continued the pressure on Eighth Army until they ended back to the 38th . Defensive positions were finally established south of the Han River. The 5th RCT was placed in reserve of the 24th Division and would remain there through the holiday period.

General Walker died in a motor vehicle accident just before Christmas on December 23, 1950. This void was filled with Lt. General Ridgway who arrived in Japan just after the holiday. General MacArthur, Commanded the Far East Theater and Korea part of his responsibility, and therefore General Ridgway first reported to him. General Ridgway took over Eighth Army at a time when all elements in retreat and needing reorganization. The flow of replacements had diminished, due to the exhaustion of the available trained replacements. The intervention of the CCF complicated the need to put boots on the ground, ASAP. The recent activation of National Guard Divisions did not solve the available replacement problem, because these Divisions were not combat ready. The activation of the Enlisted Reserves was the best source of replacements that remained to the powers to be.

Clearly the discharge of the WW II military establishment had been overdone. General Ridgway apparently was a sound choice. The defeated Eighth Army continued it's retrograde passing south of the 38th parallel, crossing the Han River and ending up on the Puk-han Han River line. Other Eighth Army units lost the City of Seoul as the friendly units withdrew south.

The first batch of ER replacements arrived in December and were assigned to various companies as needed. Some of these replacements were non commissioned officers. The 5th RCT found out that they all needed some more training. Service Company set up a combat training section and all of these ER replacements were given intense infantry training, some needed more than others. The 5th RCT was in 24th Division reserve over the holidays. While in reserve the fifth would have to provide patrols as needed.
