



## **Follow Me**



fter the Summer 2010 *Taro Leaf* went to press (my last issue), I discovered that the sculpture that stands in the main entrance to the Infantry Museum at Fort Benning, GA, the one that appeared on the front cover of the subject Taro Leaf, was made in honor of Major General Aubrey S. "Red" Newman (1904–1994).

General (then Colonel) Newman commanded the 34th Infantry Regiment of the 24th during the Battle of the Philippines in World War II. His cry of "Follow Me!" at Leyte, during the Battle of Bataan (1945), rallied his troops and has inspired American Infantrymen for decades. General Newman was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, the Army's second highest award for bravery, for his actions during this battle.
