

How I Found My Grandfather—and the 24th IDA by Heidi Edgar, Assoc. Life Member



I did not serve in the 24th Infantry Division; actually, before 2003, I cannot say I had even heard of it.

My grandfather, Elden Lloyd Broadfield (above), was a 25 year old with a wife and three boys aged 1, 3, and 5 years when he was killed in action on February 21, 1945 on Corregidor.

My dad was the three year old. That is all the information we had; my father and I wanted more!

During a search of the National Archives and Records Administration website, I discovered that my father could obtain his father's service file. But sadly, those records burned in the 1973 St. Louis fire.

The folks at NARA were able to produced a packet of papers that "brought my grandfather home."

My dad had told me that when he was young and playing in a basket-

ball game, a man came up to him and handed him a watch that he said was his father's. He said that his father had given it to him in case he did not come back. He went into a cave and the cave blew up!

So, my dad had lived years believing his dad still was in the Pacific somewhere inside a mountain, and that only a uniform and some bricks were in the casket at the funeral for his father.

But we found this was false and that he was indeed in the family cemetery the whole time!

We found out he was with the 24th Infantry Division, 34th Infantry Regiment, and A Company. We know that he died on Corregidor, February 21, 1945. Papers in the packet told us how his remains were moved from an "Isolated grave found near Queen's Tunnel Corregidor P.I.," to the states.

After learning all this, I next went off in search of the 24th Infantry Division, 34th Infantry Regiment, and A Company.

I found a website for the 24th Infantry Division, and read about the history of it. I was surprised that it was then based in Fort Riley, Kansas; I was born there!

I also found that

there was an Association, and was very happy to be able to join. I'm an Associate Life Member.

Several people in the Association sent me information. They told me about "Children of Yesterday," where I read the story of February 21, 1945. I have talked to many people, learned their stories, and learned of Elden's, too.

I tell everyone that I joined the Association to honor my grandfather and the sacrifice that he and many others made.

But I have also been given a gift. I have not met anyone that remembers him specifically, but I met a man whose brother was in the 34th and was killed a couple of days before my grandfather.

I have found out, though, that through knowing you (members of the 24th IDA) and the kind of men you are, I now know him and the kind of man he must have been. I could not ask for more. (Abstracted extensively by ED—TJT)
