The Home is a "non-medical, independent living retirement home committed to providing a home-like atmosphere offering affordable housing and services to qualified veterans and their spouses. Monthly rates are \$1,615 per couple, \$1,415 per private single room, and \$804.50 for a shared room. www.vfwretirementhome.flvfw.org

These are medallions issued by the Korean Government recognizing those veterans who served in Korea during the Korean War. They are a set of three in a jewel box, the larger one 1-3/8ths inch in diameter (shown here), another about 3/4-inch on a short pin on ribbon, and a lapel pin.

I received mine at a large event in Tampa last year;

about 30 of our Chapter members went.

But, our Chapter recently obtained 20 of these from the Korean Consulate Atlanta, and while I have no assurances any more will be available, I be willing to request them. Again, please let me know.


